

Vermont has a long and proud tradition of town-owned and managed forests. Over 168 municipalities own over 67,000 acres of forestland, all open for public benefit. The values of these town forests are diverse, including watershed protection, wildlife habitat, forest products, outdoor classrooms, and neighborhood gathering places. Outdoor forest-based recreation is both a great opportunity and a growing challenge. Recognition of the economic and community benefits of forest-based recreation is on the rise. Concurrently, increased pressure from multiple recreation groups accentuate the need for planning assistance to balance the growing recreation interests and the health of the forest. In response, the Vermont Urban & Community Forestry Program and its partners received a grant from the US Forest Service to develop a toolkit for recreation planning assistance to Vermont communities.

The toolkit will help our town develop an action-based town forest recreation plan. It will guide us through an innovative and robust planning process with a series of public workshops, a needs assessment and site analysis, and a final plan that provides actionable strategies to assist our community in taking the next steps.

This survey is all about understanding YOUR vision for our town forest. It dovetails with the first public visioning workshop, asking many of the same questions asked of the public at that event. At this point in the process we want to encourage you to think expansively about our town forest and your vision for forest-based recreation in our community. This is a time to express all your wants and desires and to get everything on the table. Try not to be bogged down in constraints on the site or current realities that might restrict what you think is possible in our town forest—we will grapple with what is possible on the site and the best ways to achieve our vision in the next phase of the project.

#### NATURAL RESOURCES

Natural resources on town forests can include areas that are ecologically significant such as significant natural communities, wetlands, larger streams and wildlife habitat. Wildlife habitat can include deer wintering areas, vernal pools, beaver ponds, mast (oak and beech) stands, ledges and early successional forests. Some larger features, such as beaver ponds, are well documented, while the presence of other smaller features, such as vernal pools, is not. In both circumstances, documenting local knowledge about these resources is essential in understanding their significance and drafting appropriate management guidelines.




