



A brief history

In 1915, Vermont passed legislation enabling municipalities to acquire property for the purpose of forest management.

The statue describes municipal forests as being:

"a tract of land primarily devoted to producing wood products, maintaining wildlife habitat, protecting water supplies, providing forest recreation and conservation education."




